## Gallery graced by Bradshaw oils

Art lovers have less than two weeks to view the works of Dove Bradshaw in the Edith Barrett Art Gallery. The exhibit is scheduled to continue through Sept. 28.

Bradshaw has had exhibits displayed in several galleries in New York City, Paris, and Tokyo.

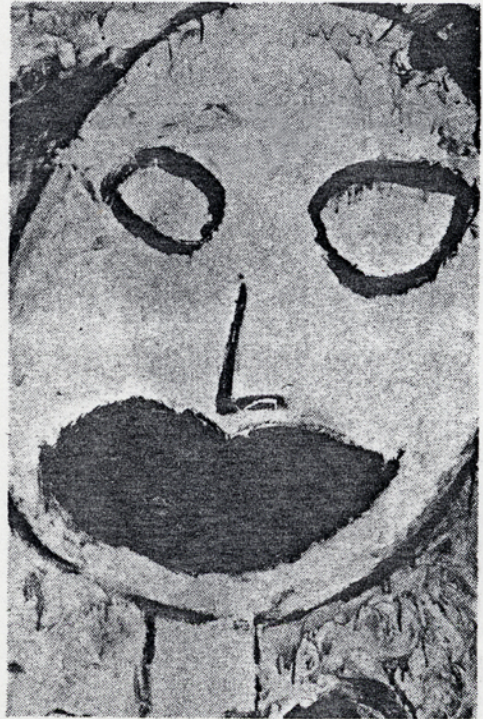
Since 1984, she has worked with the Merce Cunningham Modern Dance Troupe as artistic adviser and designer.

Bradshaw has received grants from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Pollack Krasner Foundation.

A few of her works on display in the Edith Barrett Art Gallery include: "As If I Were You," "Earwitness," "The Very Water" and "The Leaves of the Living."

Bradshaw's paintings are done in oil on a vellum surface. She also uses a combination of crayon, graphite, and china marker to create her abstracts.

Bradshaw's technique is expressionistic, showing intense color and dramatic graphics. The artwork is bold and carries a message to everyone about the realities of today and our way of life.
